Another big project for Matt's team is getting some new process equipment ready in the existing plant basement. Another tight deadline and these guys aren't sweating it one bit.

Jay Welte and his crew are really starting to focus on the new hydraulic system being put in where the boiler room used to be. There are a lot of moving parts to this project as much of the equipment is going in previously occupied space and coordination is key to making sure we are successful. Another project they are working on is reconfiguring several conveyors on the steak operation. Again, this project will require a lot of cooperation from all parties as we will be changing things up as production is happening and it is crucial that we don't slow them down. Should be an easy feat for our 2019 customer experience award winner and his team.

Josias Walker is going to be spending much of his time in February using tools from the organization system known as 5S to get our tools organized so our team can work more efficiently. This includes having a specific place where everything is stored and an accountability system to make sure tools are returned and properly maintained. 5S is part of the lean manufacturing system of continuous improvement perfected by Sioux City's own W. Edwards Deming when he took over the running of Toyota in Japan after World War II. We are confident that this will give us an extra gear in our already well-oiled machine.



## Girls Inc. Update



## **Educational Updates**




